In 2022, we aim to grow the number of active windsurfing members and improve the club's windsurfing equipment. We will start developing a club windsurfing "manual" to complement the on-the-water introductory windsurfing clinics, with the aim of improving the conversion rate of clinic participants. With respect to equipment, at the start of the season we will hold a maintenance session to triage the equipment with the goal of ensuring that the most serviceable boards and sails are rigged with the most serviceable components, and obsolete that gear is removed. On that front, we also expect to formulate an equipment acquisition strategy.

# **Saturdays**


This season is shaping up to be a vast improvement over the last two. Hopefully COVID-19 won't interfere with this one too much.
