Mentorship Program



How to Use the Boat Check-Out Board


For rated members to check out a sailboat/sailboard:

- (1) find your card green for Basic or sailboard, orange for Helm, and pink for Skipper
- (2) put your card on the board with the correct boat magnet

To check out paddlecraft:

- (1) write the date and your name on a blue paddlecraft card
- (2) put the card on the board with the magnet labeled with the type of paddlecraft

Visiting the Club Alone? Gate Training Available Now!

Members that have received "Gate Training" are able to open the gate, park in the parking lot, and are granted permission to access the boathouse when the Club is not already open. Gate Training should take no more than 30 minutes to complete. You will learn how to properly open, close, secure and take responsibility for accessing the Club. Please remember: sailing is not permitted unless the Club is "Open for Sailing" and so "Gate Training" does not permit sailboat or sailboard usage, but you may access the grounds, dock, clubhouse, kayaks, and paddle boards. You can sign up for Gate Training on our website or for a refresher if you've already had the training. We're here to help.

Others must be approved by the instructor with preference to sailors with appropriate racing skills and knowledge of the Racing Rules of Sailing.

Two racers will serve as race committee each week on a rotating basis. Our racing parameters will be set according to weather conditions in order to make this a safe environment for all participants. Racers will be responsible for following the Racing Rules of Sailing and taking penalties or lodging protests when appropriate. Contact between boats is strictly prohibited.

Boat School (multiple instructors)

Sat. 9AM-12PM, starting 5/11/24. For beginners working on their Basic rating.

Meg's Shore School

Mon. 6-8:30PM, starting 5/6/24. Learn "on shore" skills for your Basic rating. (In June/July, will also be open to those working on Helm/Skipper)

No pre-requisites or registration required for Boat School, Shore School, or Basics & Beyond!

Basics & Beyond (Anna & Kirk)

Fri. 5-8PM, starting 5/24/24. Work on your Basic rating, and for Basic rated sailors who want to continue improving their skills!
